A Silent Epidemic

Alberta has the third highest rate of self-reported spousal violence. Womens' shelters in Edmonton turned away 6244 women and children who needed help in 2019 (ACWS)

CSS is working to end violence against women and their children by helping to break the cycle of abuse and uplifting them as they begin safe, new lives.

A typical women entering Lurana shelter may be in her 20's or 30's, often have 2 or 3 young children. She may have experienced extreme isolation because of her abuse and so may have little in the way of family or financial supports which is, in part, why she needs a shelter. CSS also offers counselling, community outreach, pregnancy support and transitional housing.
