STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The Board will provide a transportation service, for its student population, that is safe, caring, comfortable, economical and timely.

Specifically

- 1. Eligible transported students shall be those whose parents reside:
 - 1.1 In urban areas, more than 2.4 km from the school they are designated to attend;
 - 1.2 In rural areas, more than 1.6 km from the school they are designated to attend; and
 - 1.3 In rural areas if the students would be forced to walk along roadways where the speed is 80 km or greater or if the student would be required to cross a railroad track.
- 2. Distances will be established and measured by the Division's transportation department.
- 3. Students will be deemed to be an eligible transported student if they are directed to a school that is not their resident school based on current transportation boundaries.
- 4. When the Board closes out a school or all classes of a grade in a school, transportation will be provided to students who would normally have attended classes in that school and must now be relocated to another school provided the eligibility requirements of Section 1 are met.
- 5. Ineligible riders may be allowed to ride with a user fee providing:
 - 5.1 There are available empty seats on the bus, and
 - 5.2 Bus stops are controllable and reasonable.
 - 5.3 Accommodating the ineligible rider is financially feasible.
- 6. Ineligible riders will be added to bus routes on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the parent to provide transportation personnel with a written schedule for children who have multi-drop scheduling.
- 8. Unless directed by the Board of Trustees, eligible transported students who reside in separate school districts of the Division shall have the option of using Parent/Guardian Provided Transportation.
 - 8.1 The Division will remunerate families who were directed to provide eligible transported students with Parent/Guardian Provided Transportation at a rate equal to the amount of Transportation grant funding received for those students.

User Fees

- 1. No parent shall pay a fee that is prohibited by the Student Transportation regulation
- Parents shall be provided with the opportunity to be consulted annually on fees and will be provided with what services and/or supports are provided by the fees prior to a fee being charged.
- 3. The Board shall approve the Division Fee Schedule for Ineligible Students during the Spring budgeting process.
- 4. The Division will support a transparent fee waiver procedure where the criteria and procedure for fee waivers are posted on the Division's website. The public shall be reminded annually of the fee waiver procedure.
- 5. If a parent no longer requires ineligible service, the Division will refund parents on a prorated basis based on how many complete months of service are remaining in the school year.
- 6. Transportation Service may be denied to students due to non-payment of ineligible user fees.
- 7. Parent disputes on fees shall be subject to appeal to the Secretary-Treasurer.
