## ONE TO ONE AT EICS

Elk Island Catholic Schools will be continuing with the Bring Your Own Device for learning program, known as "One to One". Students in Gr. 4-12 will be encouraged to bring technology that will support them in student-centred, personalized, authentic learning.

To ensure that students are utilizing technology for learning and growing as digital citizens, we have made refinements to the "One-to-One" program.

The refinements are:

## Gr. 4-8

A Chromebook is recommended as the optimal device.



## Gr. 9-12

Students are recommended to bring a device that has:

- a screen size larger than 7 inches\*
- an external keyboard

Therefore, due to these recommendations, a **Chromebook** or **laptop** is the ideal digital tool.

\*at this point in time, cell phone screen sizes are below this measurement

As always, students will use devices responsibly, and **only with the permission and direction of the teacher** or other staff member, according to school policy.

For Gr. 4-12, a device brought for learning should meet the following requirements:

- Internet ready
  - Preferably a Chrome browser
- External Keyboard
- 6 hour battery life
- 802.11ac WiFi Support
- Screen size larger than 7 inches

- Google for Education friendly. Can access:
  - Drive
  - Docs
  - Slides
  - Classroom, etc.





Prior to these refinements, cell phones were an appropriate device for learning for students in Gr. 4-12. Because this was division policy, cell phones could not be banned. However, with the revised wording, cell phone regulation can occur.

If schools would like to create their own cell phone policy, they may do so. However, it is recommended to include guidelines for when cell phones can be used to support students in their learning.

As well, the division did not recommend a specific



device. This has now changed identifying that the Chromebook is the most appropriate tool for Gr. 4-8. For Gr. 9-12 a laptop or Chromebook is ideal.

The refinement also includes an updated version of the "One-to-One User Agreement".

## **School Based Devices**

If a student does not bring their own device for learning, and it is mandatory that technology be used for an assignment or lesson, it is the school's responsibility to supply the device.
