Faith Formation and Integration is Foundational to our Pursuit of Excellence in Catholic Education

Jody Seymour, EICS Director of Student and Staff Formation (SSF), offered a brief overview of the complex responsibilities shared by her six staff at September's trustee meeting.

The role of SSF is to nurture a faithinfused academic culture of excellence through engaging students in the following areas:

FAITH INTEGRATION

This area is focused on providing support and guidance to staff and students as they grow in their understanding and commitment to faith. EICS walks with them along their faith journey and encourages them to view their world through a Catholic lens.

LEARNERS & LEARNING

All-hands-on-deck in terms of responsive instruction and quality assessment, this area is data driven and focused on supporting teachers, administrators, and students on all aspects of the Kindergarten to Grade 12 curriculum.

Systematic Wellness

All of our teachings at EICS start with the understanding that well-being in mind, body, and spirit for students and staff is a foundational prerequisite for educational excellence.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community stewardship is promoted among all students and staff through opportunities to give back to their communities, embrace newcomer families, and gather at special events at the school and division level

New Division Theme and Song Calls Us to Glorify God Through Our Actions

Based on Matthew 5:16, this year's theme for Elk Island Catholic Schools calls upon all staff and students to Go Light Our World.

"The theme Go Light Our World speaks to our mission in Catholic schools: to make disciples and share the good news and gospel teachings," explained Jody Seymour, the EICS Director of Student and Staff Formation who led the selection of this year's theme and logo. "Through allowing Christ's light into our hearts, we are called to share it with others through love, compassion, charity, and acts of service."

THEME LOGO

The selected logo shows four children releasing brightly lit floating lanterns against a night sky. It was created by Elizabeth, an EICS student.

"The lanterns in the

poster symbolize the good works of the students, and how they are letting their light shine," she said. "The lantern in the front with the school signifies the students 'shining' in academics, the lantern with the heart is them shining through their acts of charity (love), and the lantern with the cross represents them shining in their faith.

"By releasing the floating lanterns into the sky, the students are not hiding their light but letting their 'light shine before others' and glorify God who wills all of us to shine to the best of our ability."

This year's song, titled "Go Light Our World", was unveiled at our Staff Opening Day, which was celebrated with a mass at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in




