

CAREER AND TECHNOLOGY STUDIES (CAREER PATHWAYS)

Background

The Career Pathways program for secondary students is designed to develop skills students can apply in their daily lives when preparing for entry into the workplace or pursuing further learning opportunities.

Students participating in the Career Pathways program gain knowledge and skills through lab and/or coordinated workplace learning experiences, such as off-campus education and Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP).

Procedures

1. Five (5) clusters of Career Pathways are available:
 - 1.1 Business, Administration, Finance and Information Technology.
 - 1.2 Trades, Manufacturing and Transportation.
 - 1.3 Health, Recreation and Human Services.
 - 1.4 Media, Design and Communication Arts.
 - 1.5 Natural Resources.

2. The Division authored and offers Peer Mentorship courses as part of the Health cluster through the Alberta Mentorship Partnership.
